

Nainital as a Training Destination

Nainital, the 'Lake District of India,' is not only a picturesque hill station but also a multi-dimensional tourism hub. The region offers a perfect blend of Adventure, Religious, Spiritual, Leisure, Astro, and Occult Tourism, making it an ideal site for comprehensive training in tourism management.

The following categorization introduces trainees to both popular highlights and hidden gems, with suggested field visits for practical exposure.

1. Adventure Tourism

- Pangot: Birding (282+ species), Bhramasthali (2623m), Cheena Peak trail, Chataur Top, Camel's Back, Haryal Top, wilderness trek to Corbett.
- Cheena Peak: Highest peak of Nainital; Himalayan & valley views.
- Tiffin Top (Dorothy's Seat): Popular trek & picnic point.
- Mukteshwar: Thakud Top (2450m), Chauli ki Jali (cliff activities).
- Maheshkhan Birding Zone: Misty forest, elusive birds.
- Karakotak Trek (Bhimtal): Forest trek with lake vistas.
- Adventure Activities in Lakes: Bhimtal (water cycling, boating), Naukuchiyatal (kayaking, lake crossing, paragliding), Sattal (kayaking, slithering), Sariyatal Lake (boating, leisure).
- Jim Corbett National Park: India's first national park, wildlife safaris, birding.
- Bhalugaad Waterfall (Mukteshwar): Picturesque trekking waterfall.
- Hidden Gems: Tagore Top, Barapathar Rock Climbing site, Kilbury ridge treks.

2. Religious Tourism

- Naina Devi Temple: 51 Shakti Peethas.
- Hanuman Garhi: Lord Hanuman temple, sunrise point.
- Sitla Mata Mandir (Kathgodam): Known for healing powers.
- Chitrashila: Associated with Goddess Jiya Rani.
- Mukteshwar Mahadev Temple: Silent meditative temple.
- Jasuli Shaukyani Dharamshala: Silk Route mystery site.
- Kapileshwar Temple: Ancient Shiva shrine.
- Devguru Brihaspati Temple: Rare shrine dedicated to Jupiter.
- Chota Kailash: Sacred site resembling Mount Kailash.
- Godhakhal Golju Devta Temple: Temple of justice deity Golju Devta.
- Hidden Gems: Bhowali Golu Devta temple, Kotabagh temples in Corbett foothills.

3. Spiritual Tourism

- Vivekananda Circuit: Swami Vivekananda's Himalayan journey.
- Kainchi Dham: Neem Karoli Baba's world-famous ashram.
- Haidakhan Temple: Seat of Haidakhan Babaji.

- Hidden Gems: Golu Devta shrines in remote hamlets, Ghorakhal meditation sites, Ashrams at Jeolikote.

4. Leisure Tourism

- Lakes: Naini Lake, Bhimtal, Sattal, Naukuchiyatal, Sariyatal.
- Hidden Lakes: Harishtaal, Lohakham Taal, Parital, Khurpatal.
- Waterfalls: Corbett Fall, Bhalugaad, Ladhuvagaad, Dhokanay.
- Other Attractions: Snow View Point, Land's End, Eco Cave Garden, Nainital Zoo, Raj Bhawan, Gurney's House, Mall Road, Tibetan Market, Mukteshwar town.
- Hidden Gems: Jeolikote (Flora village), Pangot tea gardens, Ghodakhal Tea Estate, Himalayan Botanical Garden near Sariyatal.

5. Astro Tourism

- ARIES Observatory (Manora Peak): Public viewings, astronomy education.
- Hidden Gems: Remote night-sky points like Kunjkharak ridge and Binsar (Almora extension).

6. Occult & Festival Tourism

- Chitrashila Jagar Festival (Makar Sankranti): Local mystic traditions.
- Hidden Gems: Village Jagar ceremonies in Kumaon hamlets.

7. Field Visits

- Field Visit 1: Nainital Heritage Walk – Explore colonial-era structures, churches, Governor's House, Mall Road, Tibetan Market, and old British bungalows.
- Field Visit 2: 52 Daat (Fatehpur Baseni) – A ridge-top with 52 viewpoints, offering breathtaking Himalayan vistas — excellent for guiding & storytelling practice.
