#### Day 01 HAR KI PAURI TO RUDRAPRAYAG

**06:30 AM - 01:00 PM** (Tea / breakfast at rafting camp, Kaudiyala)

Location Name: **Har Ki Pauri**

The Har Ki Pauri is the most famous ghat on the banks of the Ganges at Haridwar. This is the ghat that witnesses the daily aarti ritual and welcomes crowds which flock the banks for the aarti. The Har ki Pauri is also known as Brahmakund and mythology suggests that Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu had visited this place during the vedic times. A temple is built around a large footmark which is believed to be the imprints of Lord Vishnu. Budget and luxury hotels are located near the Har ki Pauri to house all types of visitors and guests who visit Haridwar.

Rudraprayag is a town and a municipality in Rudraprayag district in the Indian state of Uttarakhand. Rudraprayag is one of the Panch Prayags of Alaknanda River, the point of confluence of rivers Alaknanda and Mandakini.

**Day 03 KEDARNATH TO GAURIKUND TO GOPESHWAR****08:00 AM - 01:00 PM** (After morning pooja, tea / breakfast)Location Name: **Kedarnath**

Kedarnath is a town in the Indian state of Uttarakhand and has gained importance because of the Kedarnath temple. It is a nagar panchayat in Rudraprayag district.

**01:00 PM - 02:00 PM** (Lunch halt)Location Name: **Gaurikund**

It is the base for the Kedarnath trek. The village has hot water springs and a temple dedicated to Goddess Gauri.

Gopeshwar is a township in the Garhwal hills and a municipal board within Chamoli district. It is the administrative headquarters of the Chamoli district of Uttarakhand in India.

**Day 04 GOPESHWAR TO JOSHIMATH TO BADRINATH TEMPLE****07:00 AM - 01:00 PM** (After tea / breakfast enroute)Location Name: **Gopeshwar**

Gopeshwar is a township in the Garhwal hills and a municipal board within Chamoli district. It is the administrative headquarters of the Chamoli district of Uttarakhand in India.

Joshimath is one of the four 'maths' created by Adi Shankaracharya. Joshimath is the home of Shri Badrinath during winters.

Joshimath is connected with Auli by the highest cable car of Asia. Joshimath is situated at an elevation of 1,890mts above sea level. Do visit Kalpavriksha and Narsingh temple while on a visit to Joshimath. It is situated 14kms from Joshimath.

Joshimath is the winter seat of Lord Badri.

**03:00 PM - 10:00 PM** (Aarti / darshan / pooja / dinner & night halt)Location Name: **Badrinath Temple**

Badrinath is the most sacred dham of India. It is located at an elevation of 3,133mts above sea level in the Chamoli district of Uttarakhand state. This dham was established by Adi Shankaracharya in the 9th century. The deity of Badrinath temple is Lord Vishnu. The temple is situated on the right bank of the holy Alaknanda River.

**Day 05 BADRINATH TO JOSHIMATH TO CHAMOLI****10:00 AM - 01:00 PM** (After morning pooja / darshan / tea / breakfast / visit Mana village)Location Name: **Badrinath Temple**

Badrinath temple is one of the 108 Divya Desams dedicated to Lord Vishnu.

For lunch stop at TRH Joshimath

**02:00 PM - 05:00 PM** (On the way to Adibadri)Location Name: **Joshimath**

From Joshimath, set out for Adibari.

**05:00 PM - 10:00 PM** (Dinner & night halt)Location Name: **Chamoli**

Halt for dinner in Chamoli and spend the night here.

**Day 06 CHAMOLI TO RISHIKESH TO HAR KI PAURI****07:00 AM - 01:00 PM** (After tea / breakfast enroute)Location Name: **Chamoli**

Chamoli, the abode of Gods, reputed for its shrines and temples, birthplace of 'Chipko Movement' with its strategic significance is one of the hill districts of Uttarakhand. Chamoli has proved itself to be the most spectacular in its natural assets; be it maintaining the scenery, valley aspects, water edges, floristic varieties, dramatic landform or the climatic cardinalities.
